In Cowra, the protestant churches combine to offer Protestant SRE (Special Religious Education) in the two government primary schools (Catholic SRE is also available). Alissa teaches Stage 2 classes, while Ben teaches Stage 3. One of the blessings of teaching SRE is the opportunity to get to know the school community – both the students we teach, as well as their teachers.

Across the two schools, classes are taught as Kindergarten, Years 1 and 2 (Stage 1), Years 3 and 4 (Stage 2), and Years 5 and 6 (Stage 3). This year, there are five teachers teaching across the two state schools in Cowra.

Most teachers teach at both schools, but the teaching of Stage 2 is shared between Alissa and the local Presbyterian Minister. Alissa has been teaching SRE for two whole terms and is becoming more comfortable teaching her 25 Stage 2 students, as she is better at gauging their level of understanding.

Ben continues to teach the Stage 3 children at both schools with the curriculum 'Big Questions.' For all other classes, we use the Connect curriculum, and this year we are teaching the Year C curriculum. C1 curriulum includes the story of Israel from Judges through the split in the kingdom and then to the time of the exiles, and also the return to Jerusalem (Judah only).

Then, in the second half of the year, or when the C1 curriculum is completed, we look at Jesus and some of his miracles in the Gospel of John as part of the

C2 curriculum. The focus on the kings of Israel in the first half of the year also pointed to Jesus as the promised king (2 Samuel 7), and the only perfect king, the one who was able to live a perfect life and die for our sins to bring us back to a Holy God.

Many of our SRE students will never set foot in our churches, so please pray that God speaks to them powerfully by His Spirit through His word and brings them understanding. Please pray that our students understand that they can't live a good life and be right with God on their own; that the only way of being right with God is to accept the gift God offers of His son, Jesus, and live with Jesus as king of their lives.

Please also pray for a new high school SRE teacher to be found, as the former teacher had to finish up earlier this year as they started a new job as a youth minister in a neighbouring town.

Alissa is also furthering this relationship building with the students and teachers of the school community through volunteer student reading and being on the P&C committee.

Please pray that as a visible Christian presence in this school, Ben & Alissa, together with the other scripture teachers, will point both students and their teachers to a loving creator who wants to be in relationship with them. Please pray that both schools will continue to be supportive of SRE and teachers.

St John's musical playgroup

St John's musical playgroup continues to go very well. We have already got our 'regulars,' and there is now an average of 11 children each time we meet.

This term the theme has been animals, and we had a bear-themed week last week, where each child brought their own stuffed animal or teddy bear. We had a 'teddy-bears picnic,' went on a bear hunt, read bear stories and made some bear craft.

In a few weeks, we are having a sheep theme. We plan to sing some sheep-themed songs, do a sheep craft and read "Where is the Green Sheep?". We will also read the story of the Lost Sheep from the Bible.

Please pray that as the children and their parents listen to the story of the Lost Sheep, they would understand how much they are loved by our creator God, that he would leave the 99 sheep and go and find them if they were lost. And that they would understand in sending Jesus, God has sent someone to rescue us.

Praise God for the way that we can teach these little ones through songs that God made everything, and that people are special because God made them and loves them. Pray that their understanding of God deepens as they continue to come to playgroup week after week.

It was a terrific opportunity to be fed in the Word, to fellowship with others in our Diocese, and, in particular, for Josiah and Vivienne to experience a 'Sunday School' program. Sadly, this is something that our kids don't get to enjoy very often.

Praise God for informative and thought-provoking talks from Mark and that both Josiah and Vivienne warmed up quickly to their respective programs!

Also praise God for those who organise this event year after year, so that smaller churches like ours, who are unable to do their own church weekend away, can really benefit from the teaching and fellowship.
