Hello Friends! Thank you for your continued support for God's work through us in Central Australia.

In God's kindness, young people living in bail-supported accommodation have been coming along to our church. Every Thursday we share afternoon tea, play some games and have a yarning circle together. We share about life, but we also share a story from God's word.

We have started with some parables, and it has been good to see how these young people respond to God's Word.

We recently engaged with the parable of the seed and the sower. One young man recognised his life was like the seed that fell on the road, taking no notice of God's message, but he wants his life to be like the good ground, according to what they heard from Mark 4:20: "listening to God's word, doing what he says, growing stronger for God and living his way".

There is interest among some group members in learning to play musical instruments.

Pray to God for wisdom as we think about this. The bail support program seems to be constantly understaffed and therefore they sometimes doesn't make it to our meeting. Pray that we will be able to gather weekly.

As a church, we are making our way through the book of Ecclesiastes. In it we read that God created mankind upright, but they have gone in search of many schemes (7:29) The Plain English Version puts it this way: "God made us to be good people. We have become bad people". Sin and its consequences are evident and ever-present here in the Alice. But God is good, and when humans have gone in search of many things, we know God has, in turn, gone in search for them in Jesus.
