In exciting news, 19 years since the last SU camp in Central Australia, Topher led a youth SU camp in the April school holidays. It was an encouraging time hearing from God's Word, singing, forming friendships through games and exploring the bush around Ross River. We are thankful for the team of leaders that came from six different churches in Alice Springs, and especially grateful to Ben Staunton from Connect NT, who came down from Darwin to share God's Word.

Straight after the SU camp, we took some time off and explored a few places in Central Australia with friends. Kings Canyon with our friend Jenny from Darwin, as well as the Ewaninga rock carvings and the Ilparpa claypans with Hannah from Alice Springs. It is a joy to share in God's creation with good friends.

As we share some of our recent comings and goings, please pray with us that God will continue to show us the path to take.

Topher's Western Arrernte learning has stalled. The short introductory course at the language centre gave

him some tools to work with, but there are limited opportunities to use the little he has learned.

Now and then he has recognised a word in other people's conversations at the shops, but some of the people we are sharing with at church have been Ngaanyatjarra, Walpiri or Alyawarra speakers.

Pray for both Topher and our local CMS worker, Maggie, as they seek God's wisdom in this area.

Sadly, visits to the juvenile detention centre have come to a stop.

The NT Government has changed how it runs youth justice, meaning any young person from Central Australia is flown to the detention centre in Darwin.

This has also affected some of the *alternative to custody* arrangements in town. It has been frustrating to say the least.

Now and then, Topher will meet a young person he knows in the streets, at the shops or at the local court (conveniently only a block away from church).

Pray for wisdom in these on-thespot ministry opportunities.

Some of these encounters are sad. Some of them bring joy. Some of them end with God's Word and prayer. Some don't.

Ask God to create more opportunities to share with these young people. Ask that existing relationships will grow.

One thing that has brought much encouragement is the visit of Mobile Mission Maintenance. Stew, Murray, Rose and Daphne have moved the work along on the old rectory building.

We are so thankful for their partnership in the Gospel in this practical way.
