It is a time of year when a lot of people build their incomes. So they put in a big effort in winter to help them out through the rest of the year.

Regular faces at church

Winter seasonal workers are returning to worship at The Village Church regularly now. We're seeing the same faces come through each winter along with new faces who we hope will return. All kinds of snow lovers are finding their spiritual home at The Village Church.

We're most encouraged when the people who join us plug into our church like it's their own and serve, give, and join our Home Groups. We've known from the beginning that many people will simply be glad that there's a Bible teaching church here in Jindabyne and be served by us in their time here, but those who become fully invested are a special joy for us.

During winter our gatherings see a lot of guests and seasonal workers. We have anywhere from 5–20 visitors who aren't usually from Jindabyne with us on any given Sunday. With some of our regulars not being as consistent during winter, the influx of guests keep our gatherings feeling full at anywhere from 50–75 people.

Something new

We tried something new this winter. A couple of food trucks that were down at the local caravan park couldn't remain this season. They contacted us knowing we used to have community markets on our site once a month. So, we entered into a couple of arrangements with some food trucks in the hope that it would bring foot traffic onto our property and maybe bring people through the doors. And while we didn't really see a lot of people come through our front doors, we certainly saw them and

Also, being on an afternoon, we've seen our church kids invite their friends, some of whom are coming along.

A new space

For some time we've been thinking about how we can create more space so that our kids ministry could be yearround, and also provide a space to be used as a breakout room/ prayer room.

We came up with a plan to build a permanent gazebo structure, which is almost a fully enclosed room. There's walls, a roof and insulation. We had the DA approved a while back, and we have now broken ground. The footings have been dug and we're hopeful that by the time you're reading this, the concrete slab will be complete. Once the slab's down, we think the rest of it will get built fairly quickly. We're hoping that around Easter next year we will have this space ready to go.

The gazebo will have hard plastic blinds like the ones cafes use when the weather turns cold or windy. We're also going to put some roller shutters on the outside. In the end, we'll have a secure, enclosed, second space for our church to grow into!

Please pray that our longawaited gazebo will be ready for use by next Easter. And give thanks that it's now underway.
